

Now Is the Time! Challenged by our Executive Director to work together in 2015 under this theme, messengers to our Annual Meeting last October affirmed a common objective to give more purposeful efforts to reaching our communities for Christ in the coming year. One important part of that commitment is to prepare for and to conduct *A Call to Solemn Assembly* to coincide with the National Day of Prayer, May 7, 2015. To that end, SJBA will be providing reminders, resources, and recommendations to every pastor and every member of SJBA churches. Our efforts will include the following encouragements:

Plan NOW to set aside May 7 in your church for your unique *Solemn Assembly*.

Use the 7th day of each month leading up to that day to prepare the hearts of each church member for the special day.

Focus on four great spiritual emphases: fasting, confession, repentance, and rededication.

Develop a church-wide *evangelistic strategy* that encourages and equips members to reach family, friends and neighbors with the gospel of Jesus Christ

Now Is the Time! Although we give thanks to our Lord for churches that are experiencing growth—those who are seeing people won to faith in Christ—every demographic marker tells us that *fewer and fewer* people are responding to God's call to eternal life in Christ. *More and more* people are choosing to reject the message of Christ and rejecting the invitation of churches to join their faith communities. Now Is the Time to ask the Lord to "open our eyes" that we may "see our desolations." Now Is the Time to renew our covenant relationship with God and to be more diligent, more faithful, and more intentional in our efforts to be people of the Great Commission.

Your SJBA Staff is praying that you will join us—that you will be *leaders in encouraging others*—to be a part of this call to *Solemn Assembly* in our Association. **Now Is the Time!**


