

Something To Think About Randy Gilchrist, Executive Director


We can learn a great deal from children, if we will but watch and learn. For example, when a child is learning to walk, they will many times hold on to the finger of the adult. In their wobbliness they will begin to fall letting go of the

adult finger in order to catch themselves before they face plant. However, when the adult is holding on to the hand of the child, stubbing their toe will not matter, because the parent will not let go.

Isn't that what God wants for us? That we would reach up to him and allow Him to hold on to us so that when we hit a rough road we will not fall, but continue with Him holding on to us. Too often we only want to hold on to God's pinky, so when we are walking down the rough road and stumble, we let go and try in our own effort to catch ourselves resulting in an inevitable face plant.

As we walk together through the current trials of this world, I have become more aware of our need for a Holy God to hold on to us. Maybe it's time we, as believers, turn our faces toward God in humility and allow Him to see us through these difficult times.

The writer of Hebrews in his final exhortation said in Hebrews 13:5-6, Keep your lives free from the love of money and be content with what you have, because God has said, "Never will I leave you; Never will I forsake you." So, we say with confidence, "The Lord is my helper; I will not be afraid. What can man do to me?"

ESV Psalm 50:14 Offer to God a sacrifice of thanksgiving, and perform your vows to the Most High, 15 and call upon me in the day of trouble; I will deliver you, and

you shall glorify me." ... 23 The one who offers thanksgiving as his sacrifice glorifies me; to one who orders his way rightly I will show the salvation of God!" I wonder about the expression, "sacrifice of thanksgiving," and its twin, sacrifice of praise." Grateful for parents who taught me the value of "Thank you" in response to acts of kindness, I have always appreciated those who remember to voice their gratitude for the many ways others have blessed them. But what does a *sacrifice of thanksgiving* mean?

Sacrifice suggests "above and beyond," that is, making a special effort to acknowledge another person as the source of some blessing that has come, and—like my parents taught me—God has instructed us to make certain that we acknowledge Him as the True Source of all the good in our lives. The *Thanksgiving Season* reminds us what we should be doing every day: Going out of our way to express appreciation for all the ways we have been blessed, even in this most unusual year of Covid, hurricanes, electionhostilities, and economic struggles. Our church-lives have been torn apart and we wonder if there will ever be something like *normal* again. But amid all that, we remain confident that our Lord is still sovereign, and that He continues to pour out blessings. Thanksgiving 2020—like most other things this year—will be different on the outside. The psalmist reminds us that *inside*—where it counts the most—we need to offer our sacrifices of praise because the One Who gives us life is still God!
