"Jesus said: Love your enemies—"
(Matthew 5:44)

February, dedicated to especially celebrate "Love." Love for God, Divine love; holy love; thankful love, and love for each other.

How can this rightly be accomplished? Many would reply, "I love those who love me; I avoid my enemies!" What has Jesus commanded? "Love your enemies, bless them that curse you, do good to them that hate you, and pray for them which despitefully use you, and persecute you;" Why? "That you may be the children of your Father which is in heaven!" It is helpful to know the Greek divisions of the four meanings of the word "Love."

- There is "Storge" which is family love, meaning love between mother and daughter, father, and son: natural family love.
- And "Eros" denotes a passionate feeling of a man for a woman, and vice versa including sexual attraction.
- Third is "Philia" the warmest Greek expression, describing an individual's truest, most trusted friend, the highest kind of love.
- There is "Agape" meaning no matter how this person treats you; insults or injures you, you will continue loving him/her with undying affection. This love only a Christian can achieve!

Jesus said, "Love my enemy!" He/she who hates me? How can this be? "Pray for him!" You cannot pray for him and continue to hate him. Ask blessings for him. Also ask God to change your heart, then you have—

--fulfilled God's impossible commandment. (Matthew 5:44)
