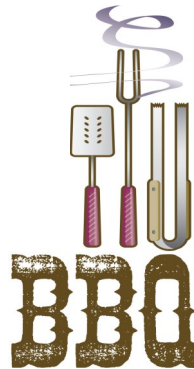

“Praise waiteth for thee, O God, in Sion: and unto thee shall the vow be performed” (Psalm 65:1 KJV)

We refer to our words as promises, or more loosely, as good intentions. To some they are nothing more than passing fancies, easily spoken, quickly forgotten. This soon becomes habitual; a hard habit to break, and too often a negative impact upon our character. A word to the wise: Do not be too quick to promise, not too prone to break your word: Others will grow to doubt you. People will say, “you can’t believe a word that person says.”

Webster’s New World Thesaurus explains the word “promise” as meaning to give one’s word; to declare; to pledge, to guarantee. The opposite to deceive; to deny; break faith. The Bible looks upon a promise made to God as a “vow,” much stricter than our causal word.

The Bible commands, “Be not rash with thy mouth, and let not thine heart be hasty to utter any thing before God: for God is in heaven, and thou upon earth: therefore let thy words be few. When thou vowest a vow unto God, defer not to pay it” (Ecclesiastes 5:2, 4-6).

Let us vow together now, with full knowledge, and in total sincerity; that we beseech God, in Jesus’s name, for a great awakening in our local areas and in our country. There is no other way but through prayer that revival can come to our world. Beloved, vow to pray daily, along with all our churches. Our text promises: “Praise waiteth for thee O God, in Sion: and unto thee shall the vow be performed” (Psalm 65:1).
