

Check List for Campers

Clothing

- Casual clothing, check with camp director for worship clothes requirements.
- Grungy clothing for messy recreation games
- Underwear
- Socks
- Sleep wear
- Shoes (tennis shoes, sandals, or walking shoes). Shoes must be worn at all times
- Modest swimsuit (two-piece suits must be covered with a t-shirt)
- Hat, if desired

Linens

- Towels and wash cloths
- Twin size sheets and blanket or a sleeping bag
- Pillow
- Beach towel for water recreation activities

Miscellaneous

- Bible with your name and address in it
- Pen and/or pencil
- Toiletries - Soap (it is a good idea to bring a container for soap after use), Toothbrush and toothpaste, Brush, comb, and any other hair necessities, Shampoo, Deodorant, etc.
- Sun block or suntan lotion
- Insect repellent, if desired
- Flashlight
- Camera, if desired
- Plastic bag for dirty/wet clothes and towels
- Money for snack shack. Check with camp director to see if snacks are provided in the cost of camp

Medication

- Medications to be taken while at camp should be brought in the original bottle and/or container and placed in a clearly labeled zip-lock bag with the camper's name and church information. Any medication is to be administered by camp nurse

DO NOT BRING

- Immodest clothing - i.e. Biker shorts, Mesh shirts, Short Shorts or halter tops, T-shirts with secular slogans (ie. beer, Bart Simpson, etc.)
- Electronic games, stereo equipment, radios, Walkmans, head phones, C.D. players, etc.
- Weapons of any kind
- Skateboards, Rollerblades
- Pagers
- Cellular phones (only adults may bring a cell phone)
- Computers
- Prank supplies (body paint, shaving cream, water balloons, water guns)
- Illegal Drugs
- Alcohol
- Any form of tobacco
- Fireworks or matches
- any material inconsistent with Christian testimony
